ADMISSION POLICY

Amankwakrom Fisheries and Agricultural Technical Institute is situated at Amankwakrom, one of the resettlement towns by the Volta River Authority due to the spread of the banks of the Volta River after the construction of the Akosombo Dam. The institute occupies a land space (arable) in excess of 1, 071 acres bounding the Afram Lake all along the north - eastern stretch of the lake.

Amankwakrom being a resettlement town made of about 5 different natives, comprising Nkami, Dadease, New kyease, Asebi and old Amankwa, and of a population of 70,000.

The Principal Vocations of the community are farming and fishing. The island nature of the district and availability of resources compelled the Ghana Government to establish the Technical Institute to train and equip the youth in Vocations to enhance their well being and advance the development of the district.

Constructional Works was started in 1975 but the various necessary preparations for the take off of the institute had to be suspended in 1979 as a result of economic constraints.

In January, 1997, with some available structures and facilities 1st year students were admitted to pursue 3-year course in Block laying and concreting; Carpentry and Joinery and Fashion.

Currently, the Institute runs the following accredited programmes.

1. Building and Construction Technology
2. Electrical Engineering Technology
3. Woodwork construction Technology
4. Electronic Engineering Technology
5. Fashion and Designing Technology
6. Creative Arts Technology
7. I.C.T Hardware
8. Catering and Hospitality
9. Agriculture Mechanization Technology
10. Welding and Fabrication Technology

As an Admission policy, Amankwakrom Fisheries and Agricultural Technical Institute which is a Training provider for cashew Value chain, has its Criteria for admitting trainees.

- i. All trainees taking part in the courses must be regularly employed or receive an in-company placement as a genuine apprentice.
- ii. Trainees must be Ghanaian citizens or Permanent residents in Ghana.
- iii. Trainees can only be enrolled on the Condition that they will complete the programme that they have been registered for, and attend all classes. This excludes unforeseen hindrances, such as sickness that occur during the time of the course.
- iv. All trainees should be literate and have completed at least basic primary school education.
